Political

The absence of a solution to the political deadlock and continuing legitimacy crisis over the GNU's mandate continue to define the context of heightened political uncertainty. In the current context, there are two political initiatives at odds with one another. The pro Al-Meshri bloc within the High Council of State (HCS) recently voted in favour of the House of Representatives' (HoR) 13TH constitutional amendment, while key international actors have announced support for the political initiative proposed by UN SRSG Abdoulaye Bathily.

Intense political manoeuvring will likely define the next few weeks against the backdrop of Bathily's proposed formation of a High-level Steering Panel for Libya. Key contentious issues such as the eligibility of dual nationals and military officials to run for president will continue to divide Libyan stakeholders and undermine progress towards a solution to the stalemate.

The UN SRSG's proposal is already facing resistance from key domestic actors such as the HoR. Consequently, Whispering Bell assesses actors opposed to the UN-led initiative will double down on their campaigns to form a new unified government as a hedge against the UN push to establish a new dialogue forum. In turn, renewed efforts to form a new government will mount the pressure on the GNU and PM Abdul Hamid Dbeibah. Amid US pressure to hold elections, Dbeibah may be compelled to reshuffle his cabinet and/or organise limited legislative elections. Of note, Dbeibah announced the formation of a government committee to implement and coordinate elections on 09 March, while Bathily provided further details on his proposal to form a High-Level Steering Panel for Libya in a press briefing on 11 March.

Security

Tripoli is operational and continues to present a relatively permissive operational environment. Sporadic incidents will continue to define security atmospherics in the western region. From a security standpoint, the status quo and stable atmospherics are set to remain as is in Tripoli. Low-impact and localised flashpoints outside government offices are possible but are unlikely to escalate or impact business operations. Targeted attacks against HoR MPs, HCS members, and other political figures are likely as political tensions peak over the next few weeks.

Oil & Gas

Disruptions to production are likely despite evidence the LNA is yet to support a coordinated oil blockade. In his latest visit to Libya, US Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) Director William Burns allegedly reiterated to Haftar the importance of safeguarding oil and gas facilities and production.

Report nº6240: US national/Libya Business founder reportedly arrested, conflicting reports

Local reports indicate the Internal Security Agency (ISA) arrested US citizen and CEO/founder of the consulting company "Libya Business", Jeff Wilson, on charges of establishing a secret organisation in Libya. Conflicting reports suggest Wilson was arrested on charges of promoting christianity. Reports indicate Wilson was arrested in an unidentified area of Tripoli.

Of note, the Agency published a Facebook post on 11 April confirming the arrest of a local and a foreign national on charges of promoting christianity, identifying the foreign national with the initials "JDFW" and employee of <u>Gateway Center</u>; an English language school in Tripoli's Zawiyat Al-Dahmani area.

Unconfirmed reports allege members of the 777 Brigade, Presidential Guard (PG), and the Nawasi Brigade who remain detained in Tripoli since the GNS's third failed incursion into Tripoli (Aug 2022), will be released soon. Of note, the aforementioned development comes shortly after reports alleged the GNU agreed to allow PG commander Ayoub Abou Rass to return to the capital at the request of the Presidential Council (PC).

High National Election Commission (HNEC) Chairman Emad Al-Sayeh discussed with British Ambassador to Libya Caroline Hurndall the latest developments regarding the electoral process and the Commission's preparedness to implement them on 11 April. For her part, Hurndall affirmed her country's continued support for the commission's efforts to hold elections. Of note, Al-Sayeh met with German Ambassador to Libya Michael Unmecht last week during which the two sides discussed the electoral process. Unmecht reiterated his country's willingness to provide technical and advisory support.

Bashagha remarks on running in elections

GNS Prime Minister Fathi Bashagha stated that running in the presidential elections remains a premature matter as it depends on the circumstances and developments that will unfold, the most important of which is support for the electoral process whether through candidacy or contributing to its success from abroad. Bashagha's remarks came in an interview with Russian news agency Sputnik on 11 April.

In addition, Bashagha expressed his belief that the unification of the military establishment is not possible in the coming period, though Libya may witness the formation of joint patrols and committees with specific objectives under the supervision of the 5+5 Joint Military Commission (JMC) as confidence-building measures between conflict parties. Bashagha affirmed his support for any steps to unify institutions and end division, noting that he was the first to break the east-west political stalemate with his visit to Benghazi in Dec 2021.

Al-Zawiya: Salafis allegedly arrested/kidnapped during anti-MB speech

Unconfirmed reports allege unidentified assailants arrested/kidnapped a group of Salafi men while they were holding a seminar against extremism and Al-Qaeda (AQ) during which they delivered an anti-Muslim Brotherhood (MB) speech in an unidentified area of Al-Zawiya on 11 April.

Sirte: Bashagha organises iftar banquet

GNS Prime Minister Fathi Bashagha organised an iftar banquet for local officials in Sirte on 11 April.

Comment: Similar iftar banquets have been organised by Libyan powerbrokers in their respective strongholds throughout Ramadan. The gatherings serve to highlight political allegiances.

Fezzan: LNA General Command confirm desert patrols

The LNA General Command's Media Office confirmed the deployment of a joint force to secure the southern region composed of the 73 Brigade, 128 Brigade, Al-Waw Company, and 672 Battalion, divided into four groups to patrol all southern border areas on 11 April. Southern Operations Room commander Mabrouk Sahban supervised the desert patrols of the joint force at the 128 Brigade Umm Al-Aranib Company HQ, after which they were divided into four groups and deployed across border areas. Western southern border patrols and 672 Battalion published images of the patrols that reached the western southern borders from the El Salvador Pass with Niger and Algeria and Gharnidiga, passing through the Nukhaza point and Tom border crossing with Niger and Wadi Bghara. The Battalion stated that the patrols come to confront any security breaches throughout Ramadan during which outlawed groups are active in irregular migration, drug trafficking, and fuel smuggling.

Report nº6244: O&G Ministry: Emirati company contracted to develop Al-Dahra Field

GNU Oil and Gas Ministry stated that correspondence between the National Oil Corporation (NOC) and Waha Oil Company (WOC) regarding the development of Al-Daha Field did not indicate that the company in charge of the project is a Libyan company. The Ministry stated the majority of consultative meetings were conducted in the UAE and stated that the contracted company is Emitari and not Libyan. Of note, in an earlier statement issued on 07 April, the NOC denied contracting with an Emirati company to develop Al-Dahra Field, confirming that Esnad Libya Oil Services is a national company registered in Benghazi (2021).
