Political

The absence of a solution to the political deadlock and continuing legitimacy crisis over the GNU's mandate continue to define the context of heightened political uncertainty. In the current context, there are two political initiatives at odds with one another. The pro Al-Meshri bloc within the High Council of State (HCS) recently voted in favour of the House of Representatives' (HoR) 13TH constitutional amendment, while key international actors have announced support for the political initiative proposed by UN SRSG Abdoulaye Bathily.

Intense political manoeuvring will likely define the next few weeks against the backdrop of Bathily's proposed formation of a High-level Steering Panel for Libya. Key contentious issues such as the eligibility of dual nationals and military officials to run for president will continue to divide Libyan stakeholders and undermine progress towards a solution to the stalemate.

The UN SRSG's proposal is already facing resistance from key domestic actors such as the HoR. Consequently, Whispering Bell assesses actors opposed to the UN-led initiative will double down on their campaigns to form a new unified government as a hedge against the UN push to establish a new dialogue forum. In turn, renewed efforts to form a new government will mount the pressure on the GNU and PM Abdul Hamid Dbeibah. Amid US pressure to hold elections, Dbeibah may be compelled to reshuffle his cabinet and/or organise limited legislative elections. Of note, Dbeibah announced the formation of a government committee to implement and coordinate elections on 09 March, while Bathily provided further details on his proposal to form a High-Level Steering Panel for Libya in a press briefing on 11 March.

Security

Tripoli is operational and continues to present a relatively permissive operational environment. Sporadic incidents will continue to define security atmospherics in the western region. From a security standpoint, the status quo and stable atmospherics are set to remain as is in Tripoli. Low-impact and localised flashpoints outside government offices are possible but are unlikely to escalate or impact business operations. Targeted attacks against HoR MPs, HCS members, and other political figures are likely as political tensions peak over the next few weeks. Beyond Tripoli, protesters in Al-Zawiya reopened roads and government buildings following civil disobedience sparked by a deteriorating security environment. The temporary stop to the protests came in response to a security plan drafted by GNU Chief of Staff (CoS) Mohammed Al-Haddad.

Oil & Gas

Disruptions to production are likely despite evidence the LNA is yet to support a coordinated oil blockade. In his latest visit to Libya, US Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) Director William Burns allegedly reiterated to Haftar the importance of safeguarding oil and gas facilities and production.

The committee discussed with Al-Sayeh taking into account HNEC's technical observations on the presidential and parliamentary electoral laws. According to Fathallah Al-Sariri representing the HCS, the joint committee has yet to discuss the presidential eligibility criteria and that it is working on the parliamentary elections first (HoR and Senate).

MRA: Two-week closure

Misrata International Airport (MRA) spokesman Suleiman AI-Juahimi stated that flights to/from the airport will be suspended for a two-week period starting 0600hrs on 13 April until 0600hrs on 27 May due to the maintenance of the airport's runway. AI-Juhaimi stated that all flights will likely be diverted to Tripoli's Mitiga International Airport (MJI), while noting that the airport seeks to complete the maintenance work before the aforementioned time frame.

Surman: Female passer-by assaulted & robbed

CCTV footage showed a dark-skinned male dressed in military uniform strangling a female on foot, robbing her belongings, and fleeing the scene in an alleyway in Surman in the daylight on 08 May. Reports indicate the attacker is affiliated with a Surman-based militia and is of Sub-Saharan African origin.

Comment: The incident could spark civil disobendeince across Surman, similar to the measures taken by Al-Zawiya residents following video footage showing the tortuing of Libyans at the hands of Sub-Saharan Africans in the city.

Garabolli Coastal Rd. closed

Reports indicate residents of Garabolli closed Garabolli's Coastal Road at the Garabolli Traffic Light with dirt barricades at night on 08 May. The locals demanded roadworks be carried out across their town, as well as the reshuffling of the Garabolli Municipal Council. Of note, the aforementioned road remains closed as of 0630hrs on 09 May. WB sources reported that Garabolli's Coastal Road reopened and dirt barricades removed at Garabolli Traffic Light in the afternoon on 09 May.

• Eastern LIS to target foreign entities

The Libyan Intelligence Service (LIS) - eastern branch threatened to take legal action and tighten security measures against all local and international governmental and non-governmental organisations (NGOs), institutions, or bodies that receive financial or other means of support from foreign organisations and suspected of serving foreign agendas and/or threatening Libyan national identity, values, and principles on 08 May.

The eastern LIS stated that such measures will be taken if the aforementioned bodies fail to disclose their financial and administrative liabilities, activities and projects, and movements of expat employees.

Comment: NGOs are particularly exposed to arbitrary detention, especially organisations involved in sensitive political work.

CBL Jan-Apr expenditure & revenue report

The Central Bank of Libya (CBL) announced that total revenues covering the period Jan through to April 2023 amounted to 31.9 billion Libyan dinars (LYD), while expenditures amounted to 24.9 billion LYD. Oil sales accounted for 19.1 billion LYD. Oil export revenues amounted to 7.02 billion, while state spending reached approximately 5.48 billion USD. Regarding the spending of political bodies, the House of Representatives (HoR) and its affiliated bodies spent over 374 million LYD, while the High Council of State (HCS) spent 13 million LYD, and the Presidential Council (PC) spent 204 million LYD. In addition, the GNU's spending amounted to 636 million LYD.

LNA 106 BDE prevents Barga independence day celebrations

LNA 106 Brigade commander Khaled Haftar prevented the "Barqa My Home Foundation" from celebrating the 74th anniversary of Barqa's independence on 08 May. In response, the Foundation issued a statement apologising for postponing the celebrations on 07 May.

Libyan-Tunisian border: GNU Mol desert patrols

GNU Ministry of Interior (MoI) reported the beginning of desert patrols and the activation of work across all security checkpoints along the Libyan-Tunisian border at a distance of 200km on 08 May. The desert patrols are supervised by Border Guard Head Mohamed Al-Marhani and come within the framework of the Ministry's security plan for Tripoli and the broader western region.
